## ORDER:

The Government of India in their letter read above have permitted the 'Rajagopal Educational Trust' to open a Polytechnic at Gudiyattam in the North Arcot District during 1960-61 for conqueting diploma courses in Civil, Mechanical and Electrical Engineering with an annual intake of 120 students.

2. The All India Council for Technical Education has estimated the cost of establishing the above Polytechnic as shown below: --

3.1 The Government of India have accepted the above recommendations of the All India Council for Technical Education and agreed to share the above expenditure as follows:

(1) 50% of the non-recurring exponditure on instructural buildings and equipment.

(ii) 50% of the net deficit in the recurring expenditure after taking into account the income from tuition fees upto the end of the current plan period; viz. 1960-1961.

The State Government have also agreed to meet 25% of the total non-recurring cost and 50% of the approved recurring net expenditure, arrived at, after deducting the tuition fees, any other net income derived in the working of the institution and the grant given by the Government of India. The recurring grant will be calculated and paid by the Director of Technical Education in accordance with the instructions is given in G. O. Ms. No. 2057 Education, dated 20th the instructions issued in G.O.Ms.No.2057 Education, dated 20th October, 1959.

4. On the above basis, the respective shares of the Central Government, State Government and the institution in respect of non-recurring east will be as follows: --

The State Government's share of the expenditure will be debited to "37. Education - Special - n - Director grants to Non-Government Special Schools - . 1 - General (IV) Polytechnics".

- 5. The expenditure is on a 'New Bervice' and the approval of the Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure will be initially met by an advance from the contingency Fund, orders regarding which will be issued in the Finance (B.G) Department separately. The Director of Technical Education is requested to intimate to the Government in the Finance (B.G) Department immediately the probable expenditure likely to be incurred upto the end of 1960.
- 6. Subject to the above conditions and also subject to the conditions stipulated in the annexure to this order, the Rajagopal Educational Trust is permitted to start a private Polytechnic at Gudiyattam during 1960-1961. Separate account in the name of the institution should be opened in a scheduled bank and cash transactions should pass through the said account as specified in G.O.Ms.No.1578 Education, dated 14th August 1958. The institution will be subject to the central and supervision of the Director of Technical Education, Madres. Madras.

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RAJAGOPAL POLYTECHNIC COLLEGE GUDIYATTAM -632 602,

- 1. The sanction of grant is subject to the Institution showing to the entire satisfaction of the State Government and Director of Technical Education that it has created sufficient income yielding Endowments to meet its share of the non-recurring and recurring expenditure during the 2nd Five Year Plan Period and the entire non-recurring expenditure thereafter.
- 2. The annual admissions to the courses should be restricted to 120 students only. viz. Civil 60, Mechanical 30 and Electrical 30.
- 3. The admission of students to the Polytechnics shall not be acnied on grounds only of religion, race, caste, sex or any of them.
- 4. Buildings and equipment should be provided as per recommendations of the All India Council for Tachnical Education and funds sanctioned for one department should not be transferred to another. The building plans should be approved by the State Public Works Department.
- 5. The institution shall not receive donations or capitation fees from its students as inducement for admission.
- 6. No new courses should be started or intake to the approved courses increased without the prior approval of the All India Council for Technical Education Regional Committee and the State Government.
- 7. The courses and their pattern should be brought in line, with the approved standards of the All India Council for Technical Education and of the State Government.
- 8: Staff should be selected by a Selection Committee which include atleast 2 experts from the panel of experts to be recommended by the Southern Regional Committee.
- 9. Teachers recruited should possess necessary qualifications and given such scales of pay as recommended by the Southern Regional Committee and the State Government. The scales of pay should not exceed those allowed for similar categories in State Government service.
- 10. There should be a governing body of the Polytechnic on the pattern and with such functions as laid down by the All India Council for Technical Education and the State Government.
- 11. All expenditure to be met out of the Union Government and the State Government grant shall be sanctioned by the Governing Body of the institution or other duly constituted body which ordinarily sanctions such expenditure or by the officiers of the institution within the limits of specific authority delegated to them.
- 12. Grants shall not be utilised for purposes other than those for which they are specifically sanctioned except with the previous approval of the Government of India and the State Government.
- 13. The institution should exercise the utmost economy in their working as also in respect of expenditure from the grants for buildings and equipment.
- 14. The grant for building and equipment will be sanctioned as per the revised orders issued in G.O. bs. No. 709 Education, dated

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PRINCIPAL

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A copy of yearly statement of accounts of the institution dury audited and showing the amounts spent for the purposes for which grants are made shall be furnished to the Government of India and the State Government.

A visiting committee or an inspector appointed by the All India Council for Technical Education/Regional Committee shall periodically visit the institution and report to the council and the State Government whether the grants given by the Governments are being properly utilised and also whother the proper standards of teaching and examination are being maintained.

- Where a grant has been given by the Union Government or State Government under specific conditions accepted by the institution, the institution concerned shall if it does not comply with those conditions be liable to refund the grant already received in such manner as may be required by the Central Government or the State Government and further grant shall be stopped.
  - The institution would not mortgage their movable and immovable properties.
  - In case the Institute happen to close down for whatever reasons, all movable and immovable properties would vest in the State Government without any encumborances.
- The grants are subject to the conditions that the accounts of the institution should be open for a test-check by the Comptroller and Auditor General or the Accountant General, Madras, at their discretions.
  - The institution should ensure for themselves endowments sufficient to given an annual income which will not be less than the average of the annual income from endowments derived by them during each of the years 1950-1951 to 1955-1956.
- 22. Only the State Government scales of pay or actual scales of pay of the staff whichever are less will be taken into account for purposes of assessment of grant; and
  - 23. The approved rates of fees in Government Polytechnics will be taken into account for calculation of the fee income of the Polytechnic for assessment of grant.
